

The GDPR Clause

In accordance with art. 13 section 1 and 2 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46 / EC (general regulation on data protection), hereinafter referred to as the GDPR, we would like to inform you that:

1. The administrator of your personal data is Akademia Górniczo-Hutnicza im. Stanisława Staszica w Krakowie (en. *AGH University of Science and Technology – AGH UST in Cracow*, for short), al. A. Mickiewicza 30, 30-059 Cracow, Poland.

3. Your personal data will be processed for the purpose of organizing the 20th *Corporate Governance - Theory and Practice* conference (KZP 2020), hereinafter referred to as the Conference, held on July 1-3, 2020 in Raclawice, Poland and the process of publishing the papers submitted for it, in particular:
 - 3.1. Contact in organizational matters.
 - 3.2. Making lists of participants and identifiers.
 - 3.3. Food and lodging organization.
 - 3.4. Preparing and sending post-conference publications.
4. The recipient of your data will be AGH UST employees or authorized persons performing activities related to the implementation of the above-mentioned purposes.
5. The formal basis for processing your personal data in accordance with art. 6, paragraph point a) and f) of the GDPR, in particular, provide:
 - a) registration of participation in the Conference,
 - b) legitimate interest pursued by the administrator, by disseminating the image of the Conference participants in the form of group photos, for information.
6. The data provided by you will also be stored after the conference, until the publication is sent for printing and sent to its authors.
7. You have the following rights related to the processing of personal data:
 - 7.1. The withdrawal of consent for further data processing.
 - 7.2. The access to your personal data.
 - 7.3. The requests to rectify your incorrect and complete incomplete personal data.
 - 7.4. The requests to delete your personal data, in particular if you withdraw your consent to the processing, if there is no other legal basis for the processing.
 - 7.5. The requests to limit the processing of your personal data.

- 7.6. The access to your personal data and rectify it, delete it, limit its processing, as well as the right to object to processing in cases and under the conditions set out in the GDPR.
- 7.7. Object to the processing of your personal data at any time. However, if your data is processed on the basis of the legally justified interest of the Conference organizers for the purpose of carrying out a public task - because of your special situation.
- 7.8. The transfer your personal data, i.e. to obtain your personal data from the Conference organizers, in a structured, commonly used data format that is machine-readable. You can send this form of data to another data administrator - on your own, and if technically possible – also via the Conference organizers. You only have this right for data that we process automatically – electronically, based on a contract with you or based on your consent.
- 7.9. Not to be subject only to automated decision making, including profiling.
- 7.10. Filing a complaint to the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection in Republic of Poland (pl. *Prezesa Polskiego Urzędu Ochrony Danych Osobowych*).
